in St. Louis Next Week.

Another Who Is Engaged to an

Unique Entertainment to Be Given To-

Mr. Keene Harwood Addington of this city will be married to Miss Cornelia W. Birch, youngest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. T. Birch of St. Louis next Thursday evening.

The date set for the ceremony is the fortieth wedding anniversary of the bride's mother, who was Miss Margaret Nelson, daughter of the well-known Thomas Withers Nelson, and one of the most beautiful girls in Virginia.

Miss Birch's brother, Mr. Thomas Withers Birch, and his wife will have been married fifteen years on Sept. 3, so that the event will be an occasion for a general family reunion.

The bride elect, a tall, queenly brunette, is well known and admired in the smart set of St. Louis for her charming, cultured personality, her versatility, and her beauty. Miss Birch is an artist with a pencil and brush, a musician of no little ability, an excellent elocutionist, and a magnificent horsewoman.

The wedding will be solemnized at 6 o'clock in the evening, at the bride's residence, No. 3039 Washington avenue, St. Louis, Rev. Dr. Holland officiating.

The decorations will be entirely in blue and white tints, with quantities of green vines and potted plants.

The bride will wear a gown of white satin brocade, embroidered in seed pearls, the low-cut corsage finished with a fall of rich Mechlin lace, which has been preserved as an heirloom from the wedding gown of Mrs. J. T. Birch's great-great-grandmother.
