

## Descendants of George Gleave

He married (1) ANN DUNCALFE 06 Jun 1679 in Knutsford, Cheshire, England. She was born Bef. 1662 in Hale Bowden, Cheshire, England, and died Abt. 1682 in Springfield, Chester County, Pennsylvania. He married (2) HESTER UNKNOWN Abt. 1687 in Chester County, Pennsylvania. She was born Bef. 1665.

George and Ann arrived in Philadelphia on September 28, 1682 on the ship "Friend's Adventure".

"George Glave (Gleave) "of Knutsford" and his wife "went clear away out of these parts with ye consent of relatives and friends."

A weaver by trade, he had married at Thomas Janney's June 6, 1679, Ann Duncalfe of Hale Bowden Parish, and had one son John, born September 14, 1680. See digested Copy of Registers of Quarterly Meeting of Cheshire and Staffordshire, 1655-1837, GSP.

Sometime in the 1680s, Ann died and George remarried. In 1687 he married Hesther, widow of Joseph Powell. Hester's maiden name is unknown. The marriage would prove to be very short as George died the following year.

The Pennsylvania Colony

On August 8, 1690, Hester, as directed by the Court, submitted an inventory of George's estate. Although the full inventory, dated November 12, 1688, is lengthy and detailed, the bottom line is George owed a lot of people money. Thirty individuals came forward claiming debts totaling 35 pounds, 13 shillings and 8 1/2 pence. The date on the Inventory also calls into question his reported date of death as it completed before that date.

There are two subsequent entries in April of the following year. The first deals with the children.

"for as much as the Estate of Georg Gleave being insufficient for the bringing up of his Children and That it doth appear to this Court that it was his desire that these persons hereafter mentioned should have the bringing up of them & being uncapable to maintaine themselves; Therefore the aforementioned Court as father of the poore in this case have placed and put forth John gleave unto Bartholomew Coppocke the Elder to serve until he is the age of twenty two years; and (P)pheby Gleave unto Bertholomew Coppocke the younger for the Terme afores".

This entry identifies both children by name and reveals they were still minors at the time they were apprenticed. It is unclear if the Coppockes were relatives of Hester's or possibly neighbors. Bartholomew Coppocke is listed as one of the appraisers of George's estate, although it is unclear if it is Sr. or Jr. More research is needed here but it is possible that Coppocke may be Hester's maiden name.

The very next entry may be the reason that Hester's stepchildren were apprenticed to the Coppockes.

"Hester Gleave brought an appraisment of her Estate appraised by Randle vernon Robert Vernon Randle Malin being shue intendeth to marry again: And ye Court Ordered John Blunston George Maris and Samuell Levis and Caleb Pusey to bee assistant unto them in the deviding of the afores estate with was the Estate of Joseph Powell deceased according to the will of the deceased; And whereas the Estate of the deceased is made the wors by the Latter husband Geo. Gleave by debts and other ways The Court doth Order that the Land shall remaine to the Widdow and children and not to be dissposed of by the advoyce of the Orphans Court."

There is no proof that John is the son of George and Ann, although it is likely. He is placed here as a possibility for further research.

This unconnected individual is listed in Tax List of Springfield Township (1729): Delaware/Chester County, PA (listed as GLAVE).

"To all Christian people to whom these presents shall come We whose names are hereunto subscribed, inhabitants of Willing town in the Hundred of Christiniana, in the County of New Castle upon Delaware and the parts adjacent, send greeting:.....and we hereby propose the acceptance of any other donations, which we or any who may subscribe further and other gifts, for the enlarging, beautifying and improving the premises to the public uses aforesaid.....Dated this 15th of December in the eleventh year of the reign of George the Second of Great Britian &c., King Anno Dom. one thousand seven hundred and thirty-seven.

Here followeth the subscribers names with their several respective subscriptions."

A John Gleaves is listed as contributing 10 schillings.

There are at least two instances where James may have served in the Revolutionary War.

A document titled Philadelphia County Muster Rolls, Philadelphia Militia, 1783-1790 Lists a James Gleaves as a private in militia under Providence Township, 1785.

The second record of "The Official roster of the soldiers of the American Revolution buried in the state of Ohio" references a grave in Wayne County. "John Yocum, Soldier of 1776" A private in Lt. James Gleaves detachment of Berks county, Pennsylvania guarding convention prisoners.

Biography of James M. Gleaves

James M. Gleaves was born in Guernsey County, Ohio, September 10, 1852. His father, James S. Gleaves, was a native of Ohio, and his grandfather, Lewis Gleaves, settled the town of Norristown, Pennsylvania. The family originated in England. James S. Gleaves married Elmira A. A. McDonald, a native of Pennsylvania, and daughter of Captain Malcolm McDonald, a native of Scotland and a captain in the British navy. They had twelve children, of whom the subject of this sketch was the second. He was a sickly boy, and in early life developed a taste for reading. He went from home at thirteen years of age, and at seventeen began to teach school. As soon as he had earned and saved money enough he entered the State University of Missouri. When within a few months of graduating his health gave out, and he was compelled to leave college.

In 1874 he came to California seeking health. He obtained employment in Merced, as a book-keeper, at \$90 per month and board. From there he went to the Yosemite, where, in the pure air of that far-famed mountain retreat, he regained his physical strength. Next, he went to San Bernadino and engaged in the drug business. For a time he was Deputy Postmaster; he also had charge of the County Hospital a while. July 4, 1875, Mr. Gleaves was married to Miss Martha A. Beardsly, a native of Connecticut and a daughter of Julius S. and Eliza Lucretia (Reed) Beardsly, both natives of that State. Mr. and Mrs. Gleaves have had five children, two of whom are living, both born in Redding. Their names are James, Malcom and Charles Beardsly.

Mr. Gleaves was elected Surveyor of Shasta County in 1886: for two years previous to that time, was

Deputy Surveyor. At the last Republican convention in Sacramento, in 1890, he was a candidate for Surveyor General. He is now United States Deputy Surveyor and United States Deputy Mineral Surveyor. Mr. Gleaves was admitted to practice at the bar of Shasta County on September 10, 1889, but does not practice law.

When he first came to Redding Mr. Gleaves was in the drug business, but was burned out, and thereby sustained a severe loss. With an undaunted courage and a determination to succeed he has taken hold of other enterprises and has met with fair success. He is now the owner of an eighteen-acre fruit ranch, the "Fair View Farm," which is beautifully situated on the banks of the Sacramento River, near Reading. He has built an attractive home, from which a beautiful view of the river and surrounding country is obtained. The choice fruits and rare flowers which surround this home are indicative of the taste and refinement of the inmates. Mrs. Gleaves takes special pride in the care and cultivation of her flowers.

Mr. Gleaves was the first Past Master of the A.O.U.W., at Redding. He was one of the men who instituted the I.O.O.F. Lodge at Redding, and has been District Deputy Grand Master in his district. By unanimous vote he was made Grand Commander of the American Legion of Honor. He is also a Master Mason.

REMEMBERING: Don Sneed

Journalism professor, former Courier reporter died Sunday

For The Courier

THIBODAUX -- Don Sneed, who more than three decades ago reported for The Courier and taught biology at Vanderbilt Catholic High School, died Sunday of a heart attack at his home in Plantation, Fla. He was 60.

Major publications reported in detail the life and career of the Florida International University professor of journalism. According to Editor & Publisher, "Students and colleagues alike remember Sneed as an inventive, hands-on teacher who paired 'nuts-and-bolts' instruction with constant guidance and encouragement." The Fort Lauderdale (Fla.) Sun-Sentinel referred to him as a "beloved professor" and quoted a student as having said he was "an inspiration" and a big-hearted man concerned about his students.

Sneed started his journalism career working for The Courier as a part-time reporter, said former Courier Publisher Ray Dill.

"He was a highly talented and dedicated journalist, who excelled at seeking out and writing compelling feature stories for us," Dill said.

Joey Kennedy, who once worked with Sneed at The Courier, credited Sneed with being directly responsible for his successful career, which includes a 1991 Pulitzer Prize Kennedy won for editorial writing. As executive editor of the Cullman (Ala.) Times, Sneed hired Kennedy in 1977 and saw him go on to the Birmingham News where he is today an editorial page writer.

Donald Gleaves Sneed was born Nov. 2, 1944, in Little Rock, Ark. He earned a bachelor's degree in political science from LSU in 1966, a master's degree in journalism from Penn State in 1981 and his doctorate in journalism from Southern Illinois University in 1984.

He taught journalism at Texas A&M, San Diego State and then chaired the department at the University of Mississippi. He joined the Florida International University faculty in 1996 and was department chairman until 1999 when he returned to full-time teaching. He spent his summers working for newspapers as a writing coach or as a copy editor. He also wrote for law journals and scholarly publications and produced short films about journalism.

He is survived by his wife, two daughters and other family members.

A memorial service will be held today in Miami. The funeral will be at 10:30 a.m. Saturday at Jones Funeral Home, 104 Cypress St., Richton, Miss., just east of Hattiesburg, Miss.
